2018-2019 Annual Report

Despite a two month pause in operations at the beginning of the fiscal year, 2018-2019 was a year in which Autism Housing Pathways (AHP) continued to move forward with its core mission: training families and individuals on housing options, and increasing the housing options available in the Commonwealth.

Services to families and individuals

We provided introductory housing training of 1-2 hours at a dozen venues, reaching about 250 people. Additionally, about 35 participants in three locations completed our daylong housing workshop. Another 31 completed Section 8 Centralized Waiting List and Department of Housing and Community Development Housing Choice Voucher Program applications through sign-up clinics at four locations. In addition, we provided basic housing information through booths at six conferences and resource fairs attended by several hundred individuals.

71 individuals and families completed housing counseling through one of three options: at no cost to clients through our institutional members; through fee-for-service in our office or in clients' homes; and through a fee-for-service arrangement with the Asperger/Autism Network (AANE).

Through our \$5,000 Local Impact Grant from Autism Speaks, we have been able to assist 8 individuals with no or ineffective family assistance to complete a range of housing applications. One formerly homeless individual moved into housing, and at the end of the year another was in the process of having an emergency application approved.

We added three videos to our Life Skills Library playlist on the AHPhousing YouTube channel, thanks to the efforts of a young man completing his Eagle Scout project.

Training of professionals

AHP also had the opportunity to train about 20 resource coordinators from affordable housing developments around New England on supporting individuals with autism to sustain tenancy. We also provided housing training to staff at the Asperger/Autism Network's LifeNet program.

Advocacy

A bill that would give families the right to create an accessory apartment for the purpose of creating housing for an elderly or disabled family member on lots of 5,000 square feet or more was re-introduced in the legislature this session. Such units could have two bedrooms, permitting a live-in aide, and property title could be passed to a special needs trust. AHP members testified before the Joint Committee on Housing this summer on how families and individuals with disabilities would benefit from the bill.

AHP president Catherine Boyle presented results from the MA Autism Housing Think Tank to members of the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) working group on residential alternatives. Additionally, AHP members provided responses to a Request for Information from DDS on desired services and service gaps for adults with autism.
