2019-2020 Annual Report

Autism Housing Pathways, like every other non-profit in the country, has faced the challenge of pivoting during a worldwide pandemic. Our service model has moved online almost entirely. Despite this daunting obstacle, we have continued to serve our core constituency, and, in fact, virtual offerings have enabled us to increase the number of people reached by some of our services.

Services to families

Our 1-to-2-hour introductory housing training, "Thinking about housing", reached about 300 people in live settings prior to the pandemic. Since then, we have reached another 170 via real time Zoom presentations and via an archived webinar uploaded to our website.

69 families participated in individual housing counseling or application assistance, either in person or via Zoom.

17 participated in a daylong housing workshop in January. We plan on taking this offering online in the spring, broken up into a four-part Zoom series.

Additionally, we reached 235 people with our video guidance on navigating the change of the Massachusetts Section 8 Centralized Waiting List to a new web platform.

We received a \$2,000 capacity building grant from CHNA 15. CHNA 15 is a "partnership between the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, hospitals, service agencies, schools, businesses, boards of health, non-profit organizations and citizens working together to improve the health of member communities". During this fiscal year, the funds were used to update and greatly expand our website, www.18Section8.org, to include information on how to apply for other types of housing in addition to Section 8. In the coming year, we will be piloting the site and a presentation to train transition professionals and family members on how to assist young people with disabilities to apply for housing before turning 22.

Services to individuals

We completed work on our \$5,000 Local Impact Grant from Autism Speaks, assisting another five individuals to complete housing applications. Of the 13 in total assisted through this grant, three who were homeless or about to be homeless obtained housing, as well as the mother of one of the participants.

Videos in our Life Skills Library playlist on our YouTube channel, AHPhousing, received 500 views this year. (Most popular were the videos on how to load and unload a dishwasher!)

Three individuals enrolled in "A Place of My Own", our free online course on how to rent successfully.

Outreach

AHP president Catherine Boyle participated in the development of "A Place in the World: Fueling Housing and Community Options for Adults with Autism and Other Neurodiversities", a report of the First Place Global Leadership Institute, in collaboration with about 25 professionals from around the country.

She also trained professionals in housing options for people with disabilities (8 professionals, including the board of the Medfield Affordable Housing Trust and the Medfield Town Planner).

Our online videos, developed to train direct support staff, reached 46 viewers. We also hosted booths at four conferences and transition fairs (three of them live and one virtual).
